As you know, the red Sanctuary lamp burns near the Tabernacle to remind us of Jesus' presence among us in the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar. We hope to set up Sanctuary Lamp Intentions whereby parishioners may request for special prayer intentions to be added to the light of the candle and brough to our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Intentions will be made for both the Tabernacle candle in the Sanctuary, and for each of the candles which adorn our Lord in the adoration chapel and will burn for one week. We hope to provide you with additional details and information in the upcoming weeks.

REFLECTION

Whose glory do you seek? There can be no share in God's glory without the cross. When Jesus prophesied his own betrayal and crucifixion, it did not make any sense to his disciples because it did not fit their understanding of what the Messiah came to do. We have heard the good news of God's word and we know the consequences of accepting it or rejecting it. But do we give our full allegiance and mold our lives according to it? Ask the Lord to fill you with his Holy Spirit and to inspire within you a reverence for his word and a readiness to obey it.

How ashamed the disciples must have been when Jesus overheard them arguing about who among them was the greatest! But aren't we like the disciples? We compare ourselves with others and desire their praise. The appetite for glory and greatness seems to be inbred in us. Who doesn't cherish the ambition to be "somebody" who others admire rather than a "nobody"?

Jesus made a dramatic gesture by embracing a child to show his disciples who really is the greatest in the kingdom of God. What can a little child possibly teach us about greatness? Children in the ancient world had no rights, position, or privileges of their own. They were socially at the "bottom of the rung" and at the service of their parents, much like the household staff and domestic servants.

What is the significance of Jesus' gesture? Jesus elevated a little child in the presence of his disciples by placing the child in a privileged position of honor. Who is the greatest in God's kingdom? The one who is humble and lowly of heart-who instead of asserting their rights willingly empty themselves of pride and self-seeking glory by taking the lowly position of a servant or child.

Jesus, himself, is our model. He came not to be served, but to serve (Matthew 20:28) Paul the Apostle states that Jesus emptied himself and took the form of a servant (Phillippians2:7). Jesus lowered himself (he whose place is at the right hand of God the Father) and took on our lowly nature that he might raise us up and clothe us in his divine nature. God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble (James 4:6). Let us empty ourselves of everything that stands in the waypride, self seeking glory, vanity, to be filled with God's own glory power and love.


